## Raku Workshops, September 8th and 15th

The nerves and excitement that always comes with trying something out of your normal practice were definitely with me the morning I pulled up to Laura's place in Healesville to experience my first raku firing. No matter what the outcome, I was determined to simply enjoy the process and not second guess my work and abilities.

I listened, with a group of other eager Valley Potters members, as Laura explained some of the glazes available and then we all got to work deciding what to paint, pour or dip our creations in. All the while keeping in mind that with raku, best to expect the unexpected!

Our pots were prewarmed in the gas fire kiln and then the burners were lit in the raku kilns and the drama began. Although it took a while for the first few loads to get to temperature, soon the three kilns were being loaded and unloaded at a rapid pace. There was work of all shapes and sizes from those present and loading the kilns was a game of Tetris at times. Once the work was heated and glowing orange, they were removed and placed in metal bins filled with newspaper. The flames started immediately and then the lid was placed on the bin and the fire robbed of oxygen, helping the glazes create those magical, surprising colours. At first I wasn't sure if I wanted to don the welders gloves and large tongs but I went for it and was rewarded with a real sense of achievement and some fantastic looking pots to take home and admire.

Thank you to Laura and the other raku veterans that made these workshops a huge success.















# Pit Firing, The Gurdies August 3rd

It was a chilly August morning when a group of diehard Valley Potters gathered together on a farm in The Gurdies to dig a big hole and burn pots.

Laura gave her talk about how to pack the pots, what may happen, expectations are to be put aside as the firing is so unpredictable. With tables set up, we began by dousing our pots with seaweed, copper, salts, anything that came to hand, excitedly discussing what wonders would emerge from the flames. Beautifully burnished pots were carefully laid in the pit by Linda with lots of encouragement and suggestions from everyone. Sawdust lined the pit and was sprinkled around the nestling pots, followed by Copper Carbonate, Rock Salt, Iron Sulphate and nicely foil wrapped pieces too. Twigs were laid at each end as a combustion point, followed by more wood, fence palings, and fire lighters to set it off. Chicken wire was laid half way through to stop larger chunks of wood dropping onto the pots. A cover of corrugated iron helped to keep the smoky goodness around the pots and create nice, black carbonising on the surfaces of the pots.

At a secondary fire, small pots were heated then pulled out to have honey and horsehair dropped onto the hot surface, creating whispy tendrils over the surfaces.

And being a Valley Potters event, we all brought a feast of epic proportions to share at lunchtime. It was a very welcoming and fun day, with many special pieces pulled from the fire the next weekend. Always a worthwhile day, with connections to fellow pyromaniacs- sorry; potters!

Start potting and be ready for next year!

## Yvonne Strik

Yvonne Strik was a Life Member and was one of the founding members of the group. Yvonne was well known for her textured "Australiana" styled vessels. Although labelled "Australiana", Yvonne's work was hardly kitsch. The colours and textures in her work were always reminiscent of the Australian Outback. Her work won the Acquistion Award in 1994. Declining eyesight led to Yvonne having to scale back her ceramic endeavors, although Yvonne did try to attend workshops and AGMs.

## **Kerrie Lightbody**

Kerrie studied at Chisholm TAFE in the early 1990's and was known for her intricate porcelain slipcast vessels. These vessels were often pierced with tiny holes. Kerrie's work also was awarded the Acquistion price twice. Kerrie also served on the Valley Potters Committee and was our president also.
