



ARALUEN CULTURAL CENTRE ALICE SPRINGS

I was privileged to be in Alice Springs for the SIXTY exhibition and Ceramics Conference this year. I wandered around the Araluen Cultural Centre, where they have four beautiful, light, open Gallery spaces displaying at the time a vast amount of Ceramics and Indigenous Artworks. After thoroughly examining all of these wonderful works, I went into the gardens where there is sculptures and a small coffee shop and also a well equipped Ceramic room. Unfortunately there was no-one around for me to talk to about their program on the day, so I just had a wander through myself. The aim is to encourage Indigenous people to create works in clay that can then be sold to help maintain the program and their Community. There was a large working space for handbuilding and I gather that some weaving and basketry may have been done there also. In other rooms there was a set of Venco wheels, loads of shelving and a decent sized kiln too. Really well set up and obviously a lovely hub to connect and create in. Then my eye was caught by a dusty glass cabinet that housed an amazing collection of ceramics by really well known potters. I took photos of some of my favourites but it was difficult through the glass. As I read the labels, I gathered at some stage there was a concerted effort by the Crafts Council of the Northern Territory to gather a collection for display. Seemed to have finished by the late nineties as all the works were dated prior to 2000. These were the names and potters that inspired me in my early days as a potter, so it was like meeting old friends again. Very well worth visiting if you can get there.

I loved the selection of Artwork there. From the exquisitely fine porcelain of Tim Strachan, Les Blakeborough and Vic Greenaway to the rough, textural surfaces of the fumed Raku by Jeff Mincham and Roro Artman. The collection included Pit fired work by Ray Jensen and brightly coloured earthenware work by Stephen Davies. It was a good cross section of many techniques and firing temperatures. Even an Allan Peascod iconic jar tucked up the back! Brought back memories of College and the enthusiasm and inspiration these people stirred up in this potter's heart.


